Materials: map (local or regional); post-it notes; pens or markers



Guidance: How do we live out our resurrection life in our families, communities, and world? If we have been transformed, what is our call to be and do that reflects our call to share the good news of Jesus' saving presence? How can we think outside the "religious" box that others may put us in? Draw an image or words to portray how we are God's people in this place. Place it on the map where or near where you live.

Materials: paper; pens, markers, or crayons



Guidance: How would you tell your resurrection story? Think about what you know, what you experience, celebrate, fear, and doubt as you reflect on this. Try it in only 6 words.

Materials: paper cutouts of butterflies; markers or pens



Guidance: Butterflies are a symbol of our transformation into new life as disciples of Jesus Christ. On a paper butterfly, write or draw a way in which you share or experience God's love in this Easter season. Hang or display the butterflies as a visible reminder of the blessings and gifts of your family or faith community.
